Salus at Drexel University Hosts 2024 White Coat Ceremony

A rite of passage for aspiring healthcare professionals, the White Coat Ceremony welcomes first-year students to Salus at Drexel University.

Elkins Park, **Pa**. - Salus at Drexel University will host its 2024 White Coat Ceremonies on Wednesday, August 14, 2024 where 336 first-year students will receive their white coats for the start of the new semester and their healthcare journey, a total of more than 390 students will enter this fall.

In the medical and healthcare professions, the White Coat Ceremony represents the transition from student to professional in training as first-year students receive their white coat – a symbol of the profession. All students in the University's clinical programs, including optometry, audiology, physician assistant studies, occupational therapy, speech-language pathology, and orthotics and prosthetics degree programs, receive a white coat.

3:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m: Audiology, Advanced Placement Optometry, Optometry Traditional (alpha L through Z), and the Optometry Accelerated Scholars programs
