- 5. University Update Dr. Barry Eckert

Dr. Eckert mentioned that Salus continuous to be an innovative institution of excellence that is widely respected and regarded across the country.

- a. General University Updates
 - i. Overall FY2020 Enrollment on Target
 - 1. Overall on target, total of 12,200 which is 100 above where the number was last year
 - 2. Applicant pools are flat and stable


- a. Increasing Scholarship Funding
- b. Had to do some negotiating with incoming AuD students
- 3. Increasing Recruitment Efforts also "Word of Mouth"
 - a. Alumni called to speak on their experience here at Salus and promote the school to students who are looking to enter the medical field
- ii. Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE)
 - 1. MSCHE approved the self-study design
 - 2. Steering Committee and Working Groups completed a GAP analysis
 - 3. Working to close gaps and prepare the report
 - 4. Site visit scheduled for 2021/2022

 - 2. Granted full re-accreditation for 8 years (maximum allowed) by ASHA CAA
 - 3. No concerns or citations
- ii. Speech Language Pathology
 - 1. Received first site accreditation in Salus history
 - 2. Granted initial accreditation for 5 years (maximum allowed) by ASHA CAA
