An advocate for the autonomy of audiology, Dr. Foltner has presented numerous lectures and authored hundreds of professional articles, chapters and a book entitled, *Success is a Decision of the Mind.* A member of the American Academy of Audiology, she served as chairman for the practice compliance committee and was recently awarded the organization's Presidential Award for her significant contributions to the academy and the profession.
