CVIM and Salus Team Up for Vision Event

Community Volunteers in Medicine and Salus University's Pennsylvania School of Optometry are holding their second annual Vision Care Event at CVIM, a blitz-style event designed to provide a large number of vision exams in a two-day period to low-income, uninsured patients who have no other access to vital vision services.

Nearly 100 CVIM patients from Chester County and surrounding counties have appointments for eye exams with CVIM and Salus staff and volunteers over the two days, using two eye "lanes" that have been formed in CVIM, plus additional equipment and clinical space. The two organizations will provide interpreters as well as doctors, interns, and an optical technician.

Eyeglasses will be provided free of charge to patients who need them, through a partnership with PA Prison Industries.
