



## Salus and DeSales Universities Host Signing Ceremony for Articulation Agreements

**Elkins Park**, **Pa. –** Salus University and DeSales University are partnering on a 4+4 Doctor of Optometry degree program, a 3+4 Doctor of Optometry degree program, and a 4+3 Master of Science in Orthotics & Prosthetics degree program.

Mittelman, OD '80, MBA, MPH, FAAO, FACHE**, president of Salus, and Gerard O'Sullivan, Ph.D., provost and vice president of academic affairs at the Elkins Park, Pennsylvania, campus, visited DeSales on May 9 to sign articulation agreements with Father James Greenfield, OSFS '84, Ed.D., president, and Terese Wignot, Ph.D., provost.

Students at DeSales who complete the 90-semester credit or 120-semester credit pre-optometry curriculum with a 3.0 GPA or higher can apply for admission to the 3+4 or 4+4 Pennsylvania College of Optometry at Salus University Doctor of Optometry degree program, respectively. PCO/Salus will reserve four seats in each class for qualifying DeSales students.

Students at DeSales who complete the 120-semester credit pre-orthotics and prosthetics curriculum with a 3.0 GPA or higher can apply for admission to the Salus 4+3 Master of Science in Orthotics and Prosthetics degree program. Salus will reserve four seats in each class of the MSOP program for qualifying DeSales students.
