(Elkins Park, PA) – A free five-week diabetes management program will be taking place at The Eye Institute of Salus University (TEI). The goal of the program, offered in conjunction with Penn State Cooperative Extension, is to help individuals with diabetes understand the most important aspects about managing their disease. Registered Dietitians and Certified Diabetes Educators will lead discussions addressing topics such as: important numbers to be aware of, planning healthy meals, and the impact of physical activity. Lab tests will be offered to measure HbA1c values.

This class will provide valuable information for those with Type 2 diabetes. Classes will take place at TEI, 1200 West Godfrey Avenue, Philadelphia, on Thursdays from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. each week from October 22 through November 19 with a three-month follow-up class on January 28. Classes will include food demonstrations, exercise ideas and group discussion. In addition to handouts and test results, participants will receive a variety of materials including a complete collection of Dining with Diabetes recipes.

Dining with Diabetes, offered through Penn State Cooperative Extension, is an approved research project conducted by Penn State University. The program is free and open to the public.
