Loomis, OD, a practicing optometrist and immediate past president of the American Optometric Association (AOA), will address Salus University's incoming students in its clinical degree programs during its white coat ceremony on Thursday, November 3, 2016 at 2 p.m. at the Reform Congregation Keneseth Israel Synagogue in Elkins Park.

The ceremony represents the transition from student to healthcare provider as the students receive the symbol of their profession – the white coat. A Diplomate of the American Board of Optometry, Dr. Loomis was awarded both Optometrist of the Year and received the Distinguished Service Award from the Colorado Optometric Association.

Dr. Loomis earned his Doctorate of Optometry from Pacific University College of Optometry and is the founder of Mountain Vista EyeCare in Littleton, Colorado.
