The Eye Institute of Salus University Receives Grant from First Hospital Foundation

Elkins Park, **Pa.** – The Eye Institute (TEI) of Salus University's Pennsylvania College of Optometry, received a \$20,000 grant from the First Hospital Foundation. The grant will be used to assist the University's Looking Out for Kids (LOFK) program designed to meet the vision care needs of underserved children in the Philadelphia area.

The First Hospital Foundation supports nonprofit organizations whose programs address the health needs of the most vulnerable and underserved population in the five-county Philadelphia metropolitan region. The LOFK vision care initiative helps provide comprehensive eye exams and eyeglasses vision care for under-insured and uninsured children in Philadelphia and its surrounding communities.

Early diagnosis and treatment of vision problems in children is key – one in four children suffers from visual difficulties, which can adversely impact their school performance and impede social development. Since its inception, the LOFK program has brightened thousands of children's lives and enhanced their educational performance.
