**Lindsay M. Bondurant Named Director of
the Pennsylvania Ear Institute of Salus University**

Elkins Park, Pa. – Lindsay M. Bondurant, PhD, has been named director of the Pennsylvania Ear Institute of Salus University (PEI). As the clinical facility of the University's Osborne College of Audiology, PEI provides comprehensive hearing care services for adults and children using a multidisciplinary approach. In her new position, Dr. Bondurant will be responsible for the day-to-day management of PEI including clinical operations, audiology clinical education and patient care.

Dr. Bondurant has extensive experience teaching at both the graduate and undergraduate level. Most recently, she was an assistant professor of audiology, a pediatric audiologist and audiology clinical supervisor at East Tennessee State University. She previously served as director of the Children's Hearing Evaluation and (Re)Habilitation Program at Illinois State University, director of Pediatric Audiology at Temple University Children's Medical Center, and director of Audiology at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia. She has written numerous journal articles, manuscripts and book chapters, and has participated in a variety of research projects and presentations.

Dr. Bondurant has served as the regional clinical advisor in the Midwest Region for the Special Olympics Health Hearing Program, as a volunteer/project coordinator for Humanitarian Audiology Outreach at the Fundacion Sonrisas que Escuchan in Guatemala City, Guatemala, the Red Bird Mission in Beverly, Kentucky and the Xanthia Project in South Africa.

She is a member of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, the Educational Audiology Association, and the Coalition for Global Hearing Health; she is also a fellow in the American Academy of Audiology. After receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree in communication sciences and disorders with highest honors from the University of Florida, Dr. Bondurant earned her Master of Science in audiology from Vanderbilt University. She holds a PhD in communication sciences and disorders from The University of Texas at Dallas.
