Elkins Park, Pa. — Douglas Gilbert, MS '20, of East Windsor, N.J., was awarded a Master of Science degree in Orientation and Mobility (O&M) from Salus University College of Education and Rehabilitation during the 120th commencement ceremony – a virtual event that streamed online May 22 due to the coronavirus pandemic.
