## Salus University participates in Independence Blue Cross Foundation National Health Equity Forum in Philadelphia

**Philadelphia, PA. -** Salus University faculty, staff and students convened at the first Independence Blue Cross Foundation Institute for Health Equity (Institute) in the Philadelphia region. The event, hosted on April 11, 2023 at the National Constitution Center, brought together hundreds of regional and national leaders representing academic medicine, national professional medical organizations, regional health systems, nonprofit organizations, government, and philanthropy to drive action in medical education, digital health and maternal health. The three-day Health Equity Forum drove sustainable, collaborative change in our region and is a model for the nation.

Salus University officials were heavily involved in the first day of the conference, centered around addressing disparities in the physician workforce in partnership with the Delaware Valley DEI Consortium. Director of Admissions, Monica Scirrotto, spoke at a recruitment session centered around Admissions, dean of the Pennsylvania College of Optometry (PCO) at Salus University, **Melissa Trego, OD '04, Resident '09, PhD**, participated in a roundtable discussion on "Making Change Happen," and the University's special assistant to the president, Dr. Juliana Mosley-Williams was involved as a panel moderator discussing curriculum addressing health equity disparities.
