Approved advanced degree programs under the agreement include Audiology, Optometry, Occupational Therapy and Physician Assistant Studies.

The partnership was created to give undergraduate students who complete a bachelor's degree from Immaculata a pathway to earn advanced degrees. A collaboration that will continue to strengthen the University's partnerships with institutions in the Philadelphia area, through the program, students can complete a Master of Science in Occupational Therapy (OT) degree or a Physician Assistant (PA) Studies degree in two years or a Doctor of Audiology (AuD) degree or a Doctor of Optometry (OD) degree in four years.
