Salus University Hosts 128th Commencement Ceremony

The Class of 2024, with more than 300 students, will receive master's and doctorate degrees during the spring ceremony.

Elkins Park, Pa. – Salus University will host its 128th commencement services for the Class of 2024 on Thursday, May 23, 2023, at 2 p.m. at the Kimmel Cultural Campus in Philadelphia. More than 300 aspiring health science professionals will receive their master's and doctorate degrees in the professions of Audiology, Biomedicine, Blindness and Low Vision Studies, Occupational Therapy, Optometry and Speech-Language Pathology.

The University will also confer an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree to Drexel University president John Fry, who will be providing the keynote address to graduates. Fry's tenure as Drexel's 14th president, which dates back to 2010, has been marked by a vision to transform the university into a private research institution with a strong public purpose. He has a distinguished background in academia, previously serving as the President of Franklin & Marshall College, executive vice president of the University of Pennsylvania, and as a management consultant in the higher education and nonprofit sectors. Under Fry's leadership, Drexel has set a national example for the execution of public-private partnerships, and become a powerful force for equitable economic development in Greater Philadelphia.
