School District of Philadelphia Students Receive Free Eye Exams at The Eye Institute of Salus University

Elkins Park, Pa. — On Thursday, December 15, The Eye Institute of Salus University will welcome students from General George Meade K-8 school for free eye exams as part of their Looking Out for Kids School Vision Program.

Led by Dr. Stanley Hatch, Pediatric Optometrist, The Eye Institute will provide students with a full, dilated eye exam, and if needed, new eyeglasses.

The Eye Institute's "Looking Out for Kids" (LOFK) School Vision Program supports economically disadvantaged, underinsured, and/or uninsured children in need of vision and hearing services in Philadelphia, and more recently, its surrounding counties (Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Bucks). The program works closely with school nurses throughout the school districts to provide vision screenings and free comprehensive eye exams to students.
