Salus University Holds Ribbon Cutting to Debut New Orthotics and Prosthetics Lab

The renovated lab space will support a new orthotics and prosthetics program at Salus University – the first in the region – which will welcome its inaugural class in fall 2022.

Elkins Park, Pa. – On Monday, August 15th, Salus University will host a ribbon-cutting event to debut a renovated, state-of-the-art lab that will support a new orthotics and prosthetics program at the University. Orthotic and prosthetic professionals design and fabricate medically supportive devices, like external braces or artificial limbs, to support and complement the lifestyle of individuals with limb loss.

The new lab facility, which is partially funded by a \$750,000 Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP) grant, will provide students with a dedicated training and learning space, in addition to the latest technology, for creating and testing orthotic and prosthetic supports.

The lab opening coincides with the launch of a new master's program for orthotics and prosthetics at Salus University, which will begin this fall (2022-2023 academic year).

The program, which has received candidacy accreditation by the National Commission on Orthotic and Prosthetic Education, will be the 14th program nationwide and is the only program in the Greater Philadelphia region (the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Hartford are the closest, existing training programs).
