Salus University to Present the 2023 Lighthouse Award to Dr. Susan Oleszewski at Annual Fundraiser Event

Set for November 11, 2023, the Looking Out for Kids (LOFK) Fundraiser will recognize a community member for their commitment to support individuals in need and raise funds for vision and hearing services for youth in the greater Philadelphia region.

Elkins Park, PA - Salus University will name Dr. Susan Oleszewski, professor emeritus, Pennsylvania College of Optometry, as the Lighthouse Award Recipient at the University's 16th annual Looking Out for Kids (LOFK) charity fundraiser on November 11, 2023, at the Switch House at the Battery in Philadelphia.

The event raises funds for Salus University's Looking Out for Kids initiative, which supports economically disadvantaged, underinsured, and/or uninsured children in need of vision and hearing services in Philadelphia, and for the last decade, its surrounding counties. In fact, now LOFK serves 10 school districts.

The 2023 Lighthouse Award recipient, Dr. Susan Oleszewski, is a Pennsylvania College of Optometry (PCO) alumna, who before retiring in 2019 spent four decades in various academic, clinical and administrative roles at PCO, The Eye Institute (TEI), PCO's main clinical facility, and then Salus. In 2007, she founded the LOFK charity initiative while executive director of Patient Care Services at TEI.
