## Management of Pituitary Tumors to be Topic of Discussion at Salus University's May Speaker Series

Elkins Park, Pa. – The Salus University Speaker Series "Endoscopic Endonasal Management of Pituitary Tumors, Craniopharyngiomas and Meningiomas" will feature James J. Evans, MD from the department of neurological surgery at Thomas Jefferson University. The May Speaker Series event will take place on Friday, May 15, 2015 from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. at the Salus University Elkins Park, PA campus in Room S300.

Dr. Evans, co-director of the Jefferson Center for Minimally Invasive Cranial Base Surgery and Endoscopic Neurosurgery, will review limitations of endonasal minimally invasive resection of these pituitary tumors by utilizing surgical videos of the procedures. In addition, he will discuss perioperative management, potential complications and outcomes.
