Salus University Clinical Site Receives Nearly \$12,000 from Patient Donation

Elkins Park, Pa. — The Eye Institute (TEI) of Salus University, one of the University's four clinical facilities, received a check donation for nearly \$12,000 from a Delaware couple. Heather Napolitano, of Rehoboth Beach, Delaware, a low vision patient who started losing her vision a decade ago, recently presented the check to Erin Kenny, OD, FAAO, chief of the William Feinbloom Vision Rehabilitation Center, the low vision service housed at TEI. The funds were raised during an annual event co-founded by Napolitano in 2015 along with her husband,

Dominick, called the SeeShore Fest, which traditionally raises money for the Foundation Fighting Blindness before adding TEI as a beneficiary as well in recent years. Napolitano's own experience receiving care at the William Feinbloom Vision Rehabilitation Center is why the couple is so passionate about donating funds to TEI. Proceeds raised during the event come from prizes, ranging from \$25 to \$5,000 in value, donated by businesses, athletes and individuals. This year's Fest was hosted at Starboard Restaurant in Dewey Beach, Delaware.
